They'll also be asking what he would like to see happen next. It seems he has also mentioned that the business has been impacted by being pulled around by various govts (no suggestion that this is relevant to his circumstances though!).

They will probably use our responses to prompt Noel's questions and then use our statement at the end. She's asked that our statement start with an explanation on why can't discuss individual cases such as Noel's.
