You was gonna return them to GRO JONES:

GRO Yeah.

JONES: So effectively erm you put nothing in er and you've got nothing

out of that trip bar the driving.

GRO Yeah.

JONES: That's fair to say.

GRO

JONES: You put no money in, you were going to get no money out of it.

GRO No.

JONES: You've gone away for 3 days to Paris.

Yeah, 2 nights, 3 days 2 nights. **GRO**

Three days 2 nights. Did he tell you why you were going? JONES:

GRO Erm well only essentially that he's got to go and see this steel

> works to discuss them taking some recycled plastic that is designed or developed that's and that's as much as I would

know.

JONES: When you went out there erm you say you met a man called

sorry erm there was a meeting with a man called GRO

GRO Yes.

JONES: Were you present at that meeting?

GRO No.

JONES: What did you do while that meeting was going on?

GRO Er well they were in the hotel foyer er 3 of them were sitting

around one table er talking er while I was er at another part of

the fover having some coffee and reading the paper.

JONES: Right which hotel was it? GRO Phoo erm I think it was something Opera erm might have been

Millennium Opera something like that.

JONES: And that's in Paris is it?

GRO Yes it's on erm Houseman, Boulevard Houseman or something.

It's supposed to be a very famous street but I'd never heard of it

before.

JONES: Right okay. So you say you sat in another part of the foyer?

GRO Yeah.

JONES: Erm how long did the meeting take?

GRO Erm...

JONES: From Thursday...

GRO Thursday.

JONES: ..morning wasn't it?

JONES: Well where were you?

GRO I was still upstairs in my room. I came down about just before 11

I would have thought.

JONES: Huhumh. Made any telephone calls while you were over there?

Erm the only calls I made while I've been over there were to my

wife.

JONES: Huhumh.

GRO

GRO Er and to er Coral Bookmakers.

JONES: To Coral Bookmakers. Did you do that on land line?

GRO Er on my mobile.

JONES: You've got a mobile What's your mobile number?

- GRO **GRO** GRO JONES: .. GRO .. **GRO** JONES: ..Yeah. GRO **GRO** JONES: GRO And how did, oh it's on your mobile yes of course. So we'll just re-iterate on that then you've gone out on Wednesday and you've come back on Friday. **GRO** Yes. JONES: Erm you've driven 2 people, Mr and Mr GRO **GRO** GRO Yes. JONES: You've been given 550 euros for petrol. You spent you say a 180 you think on petrol and parking. **GRO** Yes. You have a balance of a 100 euros in your briefcase... JONES: **GRO** Yeah. JONES: ..which was in the car this morning... **GRO** Yes. JONES: ..which you were going to give back to Mr GRO GRO With a note of my personal expenditure and everything so he could reconcile out exactly how the 550 euros had been spent. Well why why didn't you keep the 100 euro? JONES: **GRO** Cos I got no need for em. JONES: I see. **GRO** I mean I mean it wasn't like I'm giving you 550 euros, it was like here's 550 euros for your expenditure and whatever and just give me a note of what you spent, what... JONES: It's just that I'm beginning to have problems understanding things with you because obviously you must have had a fairly responsible job. **GRO** Yes. JONES: Which we haven't quite got into the depths of that yet. GRO No no.

JONES: And by what you explained to Mr Singh a little bit earlier you're

off on GRO

GRO Yes.

JONES: Erm so you know you've not been working for some time.

GRO Yes.

JONES: Fair enough and your salary happens to be in payment in

November, you said was 1500 net.

GRO Yes.

JONES: Right okay. Erm I'm just trying to work out how you...

GRO : I go from a responsible job like that to just driving around.

JONES: Well you're working on a potential of 20% commission if you win.

GRO Yes.

JONES: On horses er but as you said again to Mr Singh if you won

nothing and he'd just let you go out empty handed.

GRO Yes.

JONES: And there you are going off on a what is a fairly lengthy trip !

mean...

GRO Humh yes.

JONES: ...for nothing. Alright the the somebody put you up in a hotel but

you've literally done nothing out of the 2 of you really.

GRO Erm no but I mean you know there's an enjoyment factor there

erm GRO had a couple of bets while we were away which I didn't

know about, vast amounts, probably around about £50 or something from what we bet on while we were away and that

was about it.

JONES: Yeah. So I mean so did you ever make anything at all while you

were out there?

GRO What from...

JONES: Let's talk about these couple of bets then.

GRO Yeah.

JONES: Just for sake of argument.

GRO Yeah.

JONES: So what did you have on it, how much did you bet then?

GRO Phoo...

JONES: Yes how much did you bet then while you were away?

Erm on the Wednesday I think the bets were about a £1,000 **GRO**

possibly.

JONES: Yeah.

GRO And then on the Thursday and Friday erm GRO had...

Sorry can I if we just go on did you bet a £1,000? Is that you? JONES:

GRO Erm I put the bet on but that was **GRO** betting.

Right, that's what I'm trying to get to the bottom of. JONES:

Is that your money bets? JONES:

SINGH:

It gets a bit tricky though doesn't it? Bear in mind that you say that you're on 20% commission when it wins. Now if he's, it gets so tricky if he's asked you to go and put a bet on and it loses but it's been out of your money in the first place.

GRO

Yes.

SINGH:

Do you get what I mean? How do you balance ***

GRO

Well if you've got me briefcase...

SINGH:

Yeah.

GRO

..you know if you have a look in there there's a sheet for every day for all the bets that he does.

..oh yeah okay, erm opened it up erm and it's erm a debit card betting account. So basically what happens is you put a bet on, they take the money out of your bank account and they return any money to your bank account. Erm now in December when GRO I mean GRO has always put, phoned me up to put bets on it for a long time okay, it's not just something that's happened in December, he's been doing it for you know last 12 months probably. Erm now in December because he was like starting to use me a lot more as his like personal bookmaker you can call

me really yeah erm I then changed the account from Coral to er like a debit account where they take money out, put it back in on the bank account to a deposit account where by I put money on

deposit with them so there's funds there available for whenever I

or whenever GRO wanted to have a bet.

GRO How much did I put.

JONES: Well following the last little bit that you said, you said that you put

Right so how much did you put in then?

you deposited some money in so that your funds there.

GRO Phoo.

JONES: In fact what I'm trying to what I'm getting at the bottom of

Brendan is how much money you've actually put into this.

GRO Through my Coral account?

JONES: No just how much money you've actually put into its into this this

betting this side of the work if you like.

GRO Erm I don't think it's quite as clear cut as that really because.

JONES:

Well have you put any money into it?

GRO

I will have...

JONES:

Yourself.

GRO

...I will have put money.

JONES:

Yeah well how much?

GRO

Have I actually deposited humh well I well I don't suppose I probably haven't because when I transferred it over when I transferred it from a debit account to a deposit account I won about a £1,000's on that day right and because I didn't want it going back to the bank account because then it's out of my it's out of my system for 2 days if you know what I mean cos they pay it back like today, it do get back to my other bank account for Wednesday so effectively there's money there which I can't use so I said can you just hold it open, they said yeah we can transfer you onto a deposit account whereby you can add money onto your account or draw money off the account if there's any there whenever you want but essentially funds will always stay on that account.

Erm but it's just like er you know I just phone them up and say 3.30 at Lingfield can you put me £50's each way on such and such horse and they say fine, comes out my balance, if the horse wins or whatever there's a return on it it then goes back onto my balance.

JONES:

So so far you've you've said then that a thousand that you think was one of the day that you converted from your debit card to a debit account, is that right?

GRO

Yeah I think so yeah.

JONES:

Anything besides that?

Well I mean since then erm I have been using erm when I put bets on for GRO hd he's like lost and owed me money for covering betting.

JONES: Huhumh.

GRO I would then you know he would give me money and I would

then keeping topping my current account up.

JONES: So it's er GRO money?

GRO No cos that's money he owes me. That's money he's owed me

because I put the bets on for him, the horse has lost so then he

has to pay me, yeah?

SINGH: Would you say would you consider yourself, would it be fair to

say that you're an amateur sort of a ...

GRO Gambler.

SINGH: ..gambler?

GRO Yeah.

SINGH: Punter?

GRO Yeah.

SINGH: Racehorse and punter.

GRO Yes.

SINGH: And do you think that er you did say earlier on that once you first

met him you were a business manager.

GRO Yes___

SINGH: At Lloyds TSB and what did you do advise him on setting up an

account er his business account?

GRO Yeah well it was just basically erm you know he just wanted to

have a business account.

Since that time... SINGH:

JONES: Do you own a bank account GRO

Can you tell me what you've got? JONES:

Number one whose car were you standing beside?

So what time did you do that this morning then? JONES:

Er I got there about 9 o'clock.

JONES: Huhumh. Do you ring him before you come?

GRO No.

JONES: No does he ring you before you come?

GRO Erm occasionally he might phone up and say you know if I've like

arranged to meet him at 9 o'clock or 9.15 or whatever sometimes

he might phone up and say make it half past 9 I'm running a bit

late.

JONES: Did he ring in this morning at all?

No. GRO

JONES: Okay, so you did you why at that particular time did he turn up?

GRO Erm he phoned me er either Saturday, Sunday was it, I think it

was Saturday he phoned me up and said er that it'd be 9 o'clock

met him you were a business manager.

GRO

Yes

SINGH: At Lloyds TSB and what did you do advise him on setting up an account er his business account? Yeah well it was just basically erm you know he just wanted to GRO have a business account. SINGH: Since that time... GRO Yes. SINGH: ..yeah, have you advised him on er a business erm... **GRO** No. ..level? SINGH: **GRO** No. You know from, any advice given to from what you know in the SINGH: business world? **GRO** Er... SINGH: Banking world. GRO No not really. None at all? SINGH: **GRO** No. SINGH: He has solely, would it be fair to say that the only reason then is your knowledge of horses and betting? **GRO** Yes. And not your business acumen from Lloyds TSB business SINGH: manager? **GRO** I don't get involved in the business at all. I don't know what goes in the business or that, I'm not interested. So we're gonna ask you one good question then at any meeting SINGH: that you've been to, whether it's been here, in this country... **GRO** Oh right yes. SINGH: ..or the U er sorry abroad. In France yeah. **GRO** Yeah, have you been privy to any business meeting per SINGH: business activities of GRO **GRO** No. So the only reason is there might be betting going on? SINGH: GRO Yes.

SINGH: Or he needs someone to drive.

GRO Yes.

SINGH: What, he does drive himself though doesn't he?

GRO

Oh he yeah he does but he doesn't enjoy it and I, I mean I just offered like you know erm cos I enjoy driving, I just don't mind

getting the car and just er tatting about here and there for no

specific reason you know it's just I just enjoy doing it.

SINGH: Would he pay for any part without driving at all?

GRO No no.

SINGH: So you really rely on your weeks as er a punter?

GRO Yes and...

SINGH: To earn your money.

GRO Yes.

SINGH: Huhumh.

JONES: Do you own a bank account GRO at all?

GRO Yes yeah.

JONES: Can you tell me what you've got?

GRO Er I've got a Lloyds TSB current account.

JONES: Lloyds TSB current account. Is that in your name?

GRO Yes.

JONES: Yeah, and how much has that got in it?

GRO Or not as the case may be.

JONES: How much has that not got in it?

GRO It's about GRO overdrawn.

JONES: GRO overdrawn right, any other accounts?

GRO Erm I've got a joint account with my wife at Sainsburys.

JONES: Sainsburys, joint account, yeah.

GRO And I would think not that she ever really shows me the balance

er statements on that but I would think the last time I looked

there might have been about a GRO on there.

JONES: In credit.

GRO Yeah.

JONES: Okay. Er anything else beside all those?

GRO Erm what do you want to know about my loans or?

JONES: Go on yes.

GRO I've got a personal loan with the bank.

JONES: Personal loan with Lloyds TSB?

GRO Yeah.

JONES: And how much is that?

GRO Phoo could be I would think about GRO

JONES: Er is that GRO that you owe or a loan of GRO

GRO That's how much I owe, that would be the outstanding balance.

JONES: Right. Anything else?

GRO Er credit cards.

JONES: Huhumh. Who are they with?

GRO Phoo erm Lloyds TSB.

JONES: Yeah.

GRO Barclay card.

JONES: Yeah.

GRO Erm Morgan Stanway.

JONES: Yeah.

GRO Er Marbles.

JONES: Huhumh.

GRO Is that HFC Bank, I think it'll be HFC.

JONES: I've heard of it.

GRO Yeah.

JONES: Marbles yeah.

GRO Er erm, oh sorry.

JONES: Try not to worry, try not to if you can help it.

GRO I think I've got another one but I can't think of the name.

JONES: Any Building Society accounts?

GRO No

JONES: Any mortgage at all?

GRO Er yes.

JONES: Whose is that, in your name or?

GRO It's in the wife's name.

JONES: Mortgage in the wife's name is it, yeah.

GRO Yeah and my house is in my wife's name.

GRO	Er the only reason why the house is in GRO name is that we

JONES:	Right okay. The Lloyds TSB current account er you've got GRO

JONES:	GRO So really then you've er you haven't got much in money

JONES:	How do you survive?
GRO	How do I survive? Erm well my phoo what are my outgoings, me
L	outgoings are, thegrofor all the household bills er pays
	the mortgage erm the only outgoings er I have er cover my debts
	and going out.
SINGH:	Are you extremely lucky or or you know because what I'm trying
;	to say is
GRO	I don't think I'm lucky sitting here at the moment no but
SINGH:	What I'm trying to say to you is that
GRO	Yeah.
SINGH:	doesn't your wife turn round to you and say eh come on I'm
	doing my share what about you, I know you haven't got any
ŗ <u>-</u>	outgoings but doesn't she ever say to you you know?
GRO	No.
SINGH:	Cover your wedge.
GRO	Money's never been a motivating factor for me.
JONES:	Huhumh.

GRO

You know I don't let it worry me er perhaps I should do I don't know but you know it doesn't worry me so erm what money we've got we spend.

JONES:

Humh. Well let's talk about the events of this morning, I know we're coming towards the end of tape one, we'll change over for the second tape in a moment right.

GRO

Yeah.

JONES:

Erm you realise what happened this morning obviously...

GRO

Yes.

JONES:

..you were arrested this morning...

GRO

Yes.

JONES:

..and the person arresting you I'm sure told you that you were arrested on suspicion of money laundering.

GRO

Yes.

JONES:

I better ask you first, do you understand what you mean by that what it means by money laundering?

GRO

Well I think I do.

JONES:

Right could you tell me what you think it is?

GRO

Erm it's basically I think it's money er derived from er a criminal activity er which I think do they normally like sell it off at a discounted rate to somebody else to dispose off, I don't know. I mean that would be my general understanding of it.

JONES:

That's your general understanding of it.

GRO

Yeah well I think yeah. I don't think I'm a million miles away

there.

JONES:

Huhumh. And presumably do you appreciate that it's a criminal

offence?

GRO

I do yes.

JONES:

Right okay then. So there you were this morning standing

beside a silver BMW in Fort Dunlop car park.

GRO

Yes.

JONES:

Right. Let's take it in very very simple essentials shall we.

Number one whose car were you standing beside?

GRO

GRO

GRO That's BMW. JONES: GRO Yes. JONES: Now the 64,000 dollar question, what were you doing there? GRO Er I was driving GRO JONES: Humh. GRO ..to er the holiday hypermarket there and then I was going to go and take him GRO and his wife down to their daughters near Oxford. JONES: Right. What was going to happen at the holiday hypermarket? Well presumably he was going to take some euros in there which GRO I think converted into Stirling. JONES: Right, how do you know he was going to take some euros in there? **GRO** Erm because I know that or from what he has told me that he collects euro.. he buys euros at the Post Office in Rugeley and then takes them to a Travel Agents to sell them at a, he can, he says he can make a turn on the rate between what he buys at and what he sells at. JONES: Huhumh. So in in the event of this morning then what did you or what did you think was gonna happen? I mean I'm just trying to take it down into very very simple... GRC Yeah yeah okay. JONES: So you're there, you're in the car park... **GRO** All I do is I... JONES: ..have you driven him there so. Yeah I drive him there, he gets out the car, goes in, comes out. **GRO** JONES: He got out the car and he went to the boot, this is where I arrived, he takes out this big black holdall. **GRO** Yes yeah. JONES: Right. So what did you think was in that holdall? Well I presume there were euros in there. **GRO** JONES: You presume them are euros in there. **GRO** Yeah. JONES: Have you ever seen that holdall before?

GRO

Yes yeah he uses it regularly. Well I think it's the one that yes

he uses the same one all the time.

JONES:

Had you seen that previously this morning?

GRO

No.

JONES:

Right erm we'll come back to, go backwards through the morning in a moment. So you presume that bag had got euros in. Right, and what did you think he was going to do with the euros?

I just presumed he was going to take them into the holiday company and er exchange them for Stirling.

GRO

Huhumh. Right, well that's what you understood.

JONES: GRO

Yes.

JONES:

And in respect of today had he mentioned anything to you today about what the business was for today?

GRO

Well after he'd done that?

JONES:

No no well no just generally.

GRO

Well no he just said we're gonna go to the erm he wanted to go to the holiday hypermarket first and then we would then be driving down to Oxford to take erm his wife down to his daughters. From there I think erm he hadn't got the rest of the day exactly planned but he was talking about going over to Swindon and Lambourne er to have a look at a stable in Lambourne because he had done some business there. I think

with this GRO

JONES:

Now then you said that you drive GRO how do you come to be

driving GRO car today?

GRO

Erm well whenever I drive for him I always drive GRO car.

JONES: Right. Can you tell me how you come to pick it up then.

GRO JONES:

Er I drive round to his house in my car.

GRO

Yes.

That's your car?

JONES:

And what have you got?

GRO

I've got a Ford Focus.

JONES:

Right. So what time did you do that this morning then?

GRO

Er I got there about 9 o'clock.

Huhumh. Do you ring him before you come? JONES:

GRO No.

JONES: No does he ring you before you come?

GRO Erm occasionally he might phone up and say you know if I've like

> arranged to meet him at 9 o'clock or 9.15 or whatever sometimes he might phone up and say make it half past 9 I'm running a bit

late.

Did he ring in this morning at all? JONES:

GRO No.

Okay, so you did you why at that particular time did he turn up? JONES:

GRO Erm he phoned me er either Saturday, Sunday was it, I think it

was Saturday he phoned me up and said er that it'd be 9 o'clock

on Monday.

So in fact he had phoned you on Saturday and said 9 o'clock. JONES:

He'd pre-arranged the time.

Oh yes sorry I thought you were on about had he phoned me GRO

this morning no.

JONES: Yeah right...

GRO Yeah yeah.

JONES: ..well in fact you've now told me anyway, he rang you Saturday

and...

Yeah yeah. GRO

..and asked you to come round at 9 o'clock. JONES:

GRO Yes.

So you drive around in your red car erm does your partner drive? JONES:

GRO Yes.

JONES: Okay. Do you go in the house?

GRO No.

JONES: So what happens then?

GRO I get into his car.

JONES: Right.

Er wait for him. GRO

Have you got the keys for his car? JONES:

No he'll when I get there. GRO

JONES: Yeah.

GRO ..he'll come out, give me the keys.

JONES: He comes out, gives you the keys.

GRO I get in the car.

JONES: Right.

> Erm and then he'll generally might go back in the house or **GRO**

> > whatever and then comes out, a few minutes later he gets in the

car and away we go.

JONES: Right. This morning did that same thing happen?

Yes.

JONES: Yeah.

The only difference like today was that his wife accompanied us.

Normally it wouldn't be.

JONES: Who was the lady who was on the back seat.

JONES: Right. When he gave you the keys erm did he bring anything out

to the car?

GRO Erm he brought a box that he put on the front seat.

JONES: Huhumh.

GRO Erm and that was all I saw I think.

JONES: You saw nothing else in the car?

GRO No.

JONES: Whilst you were there on the...

GRO No.

JONES: ..or since you drove off.

GRO Yeah that's all I did basically.

JONES: Okay. And then he came back to the car and er well he and the

lady joined you.

GRO Yes.

JONES: Er...

(Buzzer on tape goes off).

That noise by the way just shows that we're coming towards the JONES:

end of the tape.

GRC Okay. JONES:

For this tape anyway.

GRO

Yeah.

JONES:

And did he say anything to you at all about what he was going to

be doing first?

GRO

Erm he said er just head towards Birmingham.

JONES:

Yeah.

GRO

Er and er he said er I think he was waiting on a phone call from somewhere to see where he might go and change his euros.

JONES:

Right okay. Well I think since it's 44 and the time is 10 past 2 .

That's all I intend to ask you. I'll ask Mr Singh if he'd like to turn

the tape off.

SINGH:

Yeah. Tape 1 being terminated now.
