This is only an idea at the moment but how would we feel about POL having a postmaster rep and an employee rep on the Board?

I've just spoken to Nick Read and he thinks there could be merit in creating some kind of advisory body of postmasters that would be able to put someone on the Board. He has been used to this kind of set up **GRO** where the Board was populated by his store owners. He sees it as a way to meet the wishes of postmasters generally (not just the claimants) to have some influence over the direction of the company. He hasn't thought through how NFSP would be involved (or be evolved).

Of course it would be a bit odd to have a postmaster rep on the Board but no employee rep so that would follow.
