I received a report from David Dixon and Doug Brown regarding concerns over the office's onch and persistent failure to return cash on time. Knowing the office to be large and having concerns that this could be a possible suspension I asked Julia Stephenson to come with me. I asked for a

copy of the last few weeks returns and holdings and payments of the office. This looked quite frightening and I did wonder why an audit had not been conducted. I rec'd the e mail on the 26th May and made it a priority for the 30th may (bank hol 29.5.06).

We arrived at the office at around 1.30pm and I told her the reason for the visit ie to check and verify the cash on hand. She was mending the lottery stand which had broken. She appeared to be delaying for time and I started to suspect that there was a problem. She had a queue and again delayed to serve the queue. She then took both myself and Julia into the back and closed the door. At this point someone approached from the shop side and it was apparent that there was some hostility between them.

Once there was the three of us alone she then told me that there would be a shortage. I asked her how much and she told me around 40K. I asked her if she knew where the shortage was, and she said did not know and she had not taken it but had she suspected a member of staff a Kathryn Ayres.

I asked her how long this had been going on and she told me since January 2006. I asked her if she had contacted anyone ie the helpline in the post office to alert them to the problem and she said she had not. I asked her how she had done a BT report without the cash and she told me she had made it balance. I asked her if she meant she had increased the cash she had and she said yes.

However it then transpired later she told me this member of staff had taken some cash and was paying it back each week. I found this odd to say the least and also that the member of staff had been given the safe keys to open up in a morning as she only lived across the road. So why had she given access to someone who she suspected of stealing. She kept saying that she had bank statements to prove she had not had the money.

During the visit whilst myself and Julia were counting the cash she told me she was looking for a cash bag which this member of staff used to pay the money back but could not find it. She was concerned about this.

She then told me she had split with her husband and had had to buy him out borrowing on the mortgage which now stands at 90K . She went on to say how much the divorce had cost her.

I suspended her pending investigation. I told her what this meant and that ID would need to interview her and I told her she could have a solicitor with her. I alerted the area office the contract manager lesley joyce Andy carpenter audits and ID. The lottery terminals figures were taken and the cash and the machine deactivated I told the retail staff not to serve anymore from the terminal.

I did a balance report and a cash check with Julia and the postmistress present. The cash missing appears to be around £54000.

The office was locked up and I took all the safe keys with me that she had. I asked her if these were all the keys and she said yes. The safe code was 1915 enter 6 . I will be meeting with the auditors at 8.30am 1.6.06 and she will be present as well. The post was taken as well today .

I have papers and a statement from Janet which she signed and this was witnessed by myself and Julia.

The other suspicion is that the staff acted in a strange way either they are involved or they at least knew there was a problem. This may be a hunch but I have a feeling that the staff are involved as well. With the lack of cash in the office today I don't know how they could have functioned properly without running out.

I also mentioned about someone running the post office but she did not comment and I did ring newrose to see if anyone could help but at this moment in time it could be the staff involved so the whole office would need new staff in there etc.

I also informed my HOA.

One of my colleagues spoke to the postmaster recently as they had ordered cash when they were asked to return cash. Looking at this office in detail, we have not had a valid cash declaration since Tuesday 16th May and we have had 10-20% invalid cash declarations historically.

The office is ordering large volumes of notes when they should be returning cash, but they actually denied holding the cash that was owing on Saturday. Even though the cash declaration for that Saturday was invalid, the figure that we got from a different source would still be accurate.

The levels of cash have now reached a worrying point, so would it be possible for someone to visit the branch to make sure all funds are at the premises. They need to remedy the problem with their cash declarations, and also reduce their cash holdings as they are as high as previously declared.

Doug,

We have serious concerns about this office. The generated ONCH was 74k on Saturday, but the postmaster said that they had no where near that amount. They did not say exactly how much cash they reckon to have held, but there is a discrepancy.

I arrived at the office today to do a full audit with the auditors Lynne and Paul. The branch was also defunded as until a full investigation has been carried out the current staff may be implicated and currently I was unable to find anyone to run the post office. The postmistress Janet Skinner gave me the assistant branch manager's tel no to contact her to run the post office but she could

be implicated in the incident and loss of cash to the branch.

Janet skinner arrived at the office at around 0845 and she left the branch at around 10.30 as she had a appointment at the solicitor's. Diane whittaker is interviewing her tomorrow.

The branch was left at just over 59K short see audit report for final figures.

The lottery has been deactivated. I took the keys the card accounts and the date stamps and also some cards left by customers to Bransholme BO, one being a TSB debit card which I intend to take to the bank tomorrow.

Also there was some change in an envelope for Shawn £48.42p which I too have. I am not sure at this stage what to do with the cash he may hopefully contact the helpline and ask for the receipts and change.

The office was defunded and emptied of all the cash and stock.

I was surprised to learn of a delivery of cash yesterday which fortunately because the office was closed due to myself being there was not delivered. It was 40K in total.

Newrose are interested in running it but I am not so sure whether they have the staff at this stage as I feel unable to use the staff in the post office as I am sure they knew what was going.

A lady asked when the po was opening as she said that it was always running out of cash.

Also whilst I was there Janet handed me some empty cash bags of £20 notes from a bank but she told me it contained £50 notes of which there was 5K and the customer had bought premium bonds. I took these and have left them for the ID to look at as it appears there could be some money laundering but the staff did not ask for ID and again this is suspicious. She went onto say that the same customer deposited another 3K in cash for the same too which suggests the office could be used to launder money. She thought the cash could have come from a bank which was robbed in Hull around that time.

The mail and parcels were collected and I took the boxes of accounts to the Branch office at Bransholme BO. Also an envelope with Janet's name on was there too which I left with a statement she gave me yesterday.

The safe and alarms were set at the branch today and I left it at that. Also just to say the office codes will need changing when someone takes over and I am not sure if all the keys have been handed over although she said all the safe keys had but there was only two key fobs which I have and she did say she had some more. I have asked Diane Matthews to ask her about keys in the interview. I rang Diane to update her on this etc.

There is some smoke and dye notes which have been opened and these need to be collected by Romec when the office reopens.

Another issue was that the false roof had collapsed and there was a space in the ceiling which I was not happy with she did say she had contacted the landlord but he had not repaired it.

I felt at this stage there was nothing more I could do for this sorry situation.

In response to your letter dated 24th July, I would like to take the opportunity to put forward the reasons for my actions;

I understand the reasons for the termination of my contract of Post Office Manager. In addition to this I also understand the implications you have listed. I informed Diane Matthews on the 31st May that I had not stolen any money from the Post Office, and again re-iterate this statement. In addition to this I admit that I had falsified records to cover losses, losses I had naively hoped would be found in paperwork. As the amounts worsened as the accounts now show I can only put my not reporting my findings down to sheer panic and hope of resolution. I would like to stress this was not done for purposes of dishonesty.

With regards to Katherine Ayres, mistakes were made by her and discussed in detail, Katherine admitted her error but could not afford to pay back the shortages; I felt that as an employer Katherine needed my support I allowed her against my better judgement the opportunity to pay back monies that were short. Evidently this did not happen, I trusted she would repay this as she was aware I could not afford to make these payments on her behalf, I was not aware this would constitute money lending, I am very shocked that this would be considered, but again understand the implications.

I have worked in the Post Office environment working in different offices around Hull for many years, I have always been considered as a reliable trustworthy member of staff in all offices I have worked in, I have also been in managerial positions in certain offices. At the time of taking over this office I had also taken on Bomin Road office, which regretfully closed down, as it was surplus to requirements. There were no discrepancies at this office.

The office in question became a tense environment; I foolishly discussed the losses with my staff whom I trusted. I can understand all of allegations that have been made against me and am willing to do whatever it takes to make amends for my stupidity, I must stress to you that I have not and never have stolen in my life and feel my own naivety and trust in others has left me in what I consider to be a treacherous frightening situation which cannot redeem myself from.

Dear Ms Skinner

I am writing following my letter of 27th June 06 in which I gave you opportunity to put forward reasons why your contract for services should not be summarily terminated. This letter was sent to your home address and has been received, so I can only assume that you do not wish to put forward any reasons why I should not terminate your Contract For Services, either at a personal interview or in writing.

Therefore having reviewed the papers relating to this case very carefully and after considering all the facts I have available to me, I have decided to summarily terminate your Contract For Services as Subpostmaster of Post Office®, North Bransholme branch from the date of your suspension. On the grounds that: Due to Diane Hoyles visit to Post Office®, North Bransholme branch on 30th May 06, this branch was subsequently audited on 31st May, in which it was discovered that there was a loss of £59,175.39. Diane Matthews Investigations Manager interviewed you on 01st June 06, you informed her that you had not stolen the money but had been falsifying your accounts since November 2004 to cover losses. Falsification of accounts is clearly unacceptable, is a criminal offence and breaches Section 12 para 4 of the Subpostmasters contract. Section 19 para 1 of the Subpostmasters contract states "Dishonesty is viewed most seriously and any Subpostmaster or Sub-Office Assistant believed to have carried, or taken part in, an act of dishonesty against Post Office Ltd may be prosecuted. Furthermore, any Subpostmaster so involved renders himself liable to summary termination of his contract."

You are also reported stating in your interview with investigations that Katherine Ayres had admitted taking some money from the Post Office accounts, which you were aware of and you did not report. The fact that you did not report her dishonesty leaves you in breach of Section 15 para 10 and 11, also Section 19 para 7. Supplementary to this, Section 15 para 2 states "Assistants are employees of the Subpostmaster. A Subpostmaster will be held wholly responsible for any failure, on the part of his assistants, to apply Post Office rules, or to provide a proper standard of service to the public. He will also be required to make good any deficiency, of cash or stock, which may result from his assistant's actions." You were aware of losses in

the accounts, which you chose to hide rather than make good as per your contract Section 12 para 12.

Even though you had concerns about Katherine Ayres stealing Post Office money, which you were responsible for as Subpostmaster, you did not take steps to prevent further theft and gave her keys to the Post Office/safe. Therefore I believe that you have not safeguarded Post Office funds adequately and have breached Section 12 para's 5 and 6. You also allowed Katherine repayment terms in which to pay back money that she had stolen, which I believe constitutes lending her money which breaches Section 17 para 15.

I also believe that you have breached Section 1 para's 13 to 15 as you have not followed operational rules and instructions correctly because: Losses were occurring and you did not place sufficient controls in the branch to stop them occurring. Prior to the suspension, the Inventory team had asked you to return money and you chose to ignore this instruction. You also had not registered your assistants Colleen Kays, Theresa Holmes and Wendy Lyell.

You may, if you wish, appeal against my decision. If it is your intention to appeal, you should notify me, in writing by 26th July 06. The format of the appeal can be either a personal interview or written submission. Should you wish to progress this avenue, I will arrange for the appeal to be heard by a member of Post Office Ltd Appeals Authority.

Hi Mark,

Please find an e-mail from Joanne Wisker regarding North Bransholme P.O. As you are aware the manageress was suspended last Friday morning following the alleged theft of £2,000 allied to other misdemeanours that totalled in excess of another £800. I have discussed the matter with Andy Carpenter and he has requested an audit to try to ensure there has been no other wrong doings. I was hoping that this would draw a line under the matter and that Joanne would then continue at North Bransholme. Unfortunately, following the attached e-mail. I had a telephone conversation with a very tearful and emotional Joanne this morning. Because the suspended manageress worked full time and opened and closed the business etc. on a daily basis a chronic staff shortage has followed at North Bransholme. Joanne is trying to keep North Bransholme running and is having to spend the majority of her time there. However, this is impacting on her other office at Chanterlands Ave., which is already stretched as Joanne is currently advertising for staff there. Allied to the fact that the busy Christmas period is almost upon us, I am, like Joanne, greatly concerned about the situation at both offices.

Furthermore, Joanne did not take out a loan to re-open the North Bransholme office but preferred to run it on the Chanterlands funds. The £3,000 shortage that she is culpable for has stretched her resources to breaking point and thus she has told me she wishes to close the office. The current building that the N. Bransholme office is situated in is leased for 6 months, but Joanne has had the sense to re-open the office as a separate limited company - so she could cut her losses and run!

To make matters even more infuriating from my point of view Kwiksave situated in a much better position and in a building just around the corner, last week approached Joanne try to arrange a meeting to discuss the possibility of re-siting the Post Office in the supermarket - something that I feel would be greatly advantageous to us.

I really do not want Joanne to walk away from North Bransholme but her present position is not good. I know that we cannot assist with staffing but I understand that we may be able to assist with the financial side through the Hardship fund, or something similar, is this so? And if so what can I do about it?

Hi Andy,

An update on the proceedings at North Bransholme. I received a telephone call at around 4.45p.m. on Thursday 23rd. November from Joanne Wisker, the interim spmr at North Bransholme and spmr at Chanterlands Avenue. She informed me that her manager at North Bransholme, Wendy Lyall had informed her that she was £560 short in £2 coins and that Wendy thought she had given them out in error to a customer requesting change. Joanne also told me that Wendy, via Colleen, another member of staff, had stated that as it was her fault she would repay the amount.. The office has separate accounting procedures for each assistant, so Joanne decided to undertake a balance on Wendy's transactions and found a further deficit, that including the original £560, totalled £869.44.

On returning to Chanterlands Avenue Joanne received a call from one of her clerks at North Bransholme, Avril De Vere who informed her that Wendy had taken £2000 from her pouch and said that she would replace it on Friday. It appears that the original reason given by Wendy for taking the £2,000 was that Joanne was coming to check her till and that it was wrong. Avril did not mention this whilst Wendy was present and waited until she could tell Joanne privately, which she did via a 'phone call.

A balance snapshot was completed on Friday and Avril's balance was £1999.92 in deficit. Joanne met her manager on opening on Friday and asked her about the £2,000 to which Wendy replied she knew nothing about the matter. Joanne then precautionary suspended her manager and undertook the balance which confirmed the £2000 missing. As a result the loss has been declared and all snapshot balance accounts are present for the North Bransholme office.

Because of the history of the North Bransholme office and ongoing proceedings Diane Matthews of Post Office Investigations has been informed. Joanne has informed the police and at the moment the matter is in their hands. I have informed Joanne that she, as interim spmr, is culpable for the loss and she is fully aware of this point, however I did also say that the Post Office may be able to assist (ie: hardship payment).

Joanne is also very keen to draw a line under the matter and move on and stated that she would not mind a full audit to enable her and the remaining staff to do so. I wish to emphasise at this point that this measure should not implicate Joanne in any way whatsoever. The fact that she reported the matter to me immediately she realised the severity of it, allied to the balance snapshot and declared loss absolves her of any wrong doing, in fact I feel that she has

I understand that North Bransholme had contacted your unit yesterday because Diane Hoyles has now reiterated the confirmation that North Bransholme (FAD 174 321) will be reopening on

Monday (2/10/06), and the branch would of course like to resume sales of Lottery, asap.

Please find copies, below, of the earlier e-mails, I forwarded to Camelot a month ago. To date I have not had a response, and I have to apologise myself for not chasing up on this earlier, which is partially due to all the changes.

However:

- a) I shall be going on leave for 2 weeks after today, and
- b) My colleagues within POL will need to establish who within Operations will be best placed to deal with these types of queries, to liaise with Dave.

I would respectfully appreciate your assistance please in following up with Richard Ashpole to enquire if something can be done to get this branch back on line.

To recap - The North Bransholme OLT was suppressed on 30/5/06 due to the precautionary suspension of the SPMR but was removed completely by Camelot on 23/6 - and I am advised that the terminal was actually removed following the advice of the relevant retailer. I can see why Camelot would not want to have this terminal lying dormant - however, the OLT was part of the overall Post Office retail offer, and as far as I am aware - this should as "a restricted product", remain a part of the service/product bundle available from this branch; so it might be preferable to look to see if this can be picked up once more.

Originally, this matter was forwarded across to David Evans at Richard Ashpole's request, and I recollect the ISDN line usage was also a factor as this was likely to be cancelled because the OLT was dormant.

Dave - I would be grateful if you could go back to Dean Bush with an update on this matter please, (Tel: **GRO**) and possibly also keep Chris and Simon informed of the matter in my absence, too.

I am writing following my letter of 27th June 06 in which I gave you opportunity to put forward reasons why your contract for services should not be summarily terminated. This letter was sent to your home address and has been received, so I can only assume that you do not wish to put forward any reasons why I should not terminate your Contract For Services, either at a personal interview or in writing.

Therefore having reviewed the papers relating to this case very carefully and after considering all the facts I have available to me, I have decided to summarily terminate your Contract For Services as Subpostmaster of Post Office®, North Bransholme branch from the date of your suspension. On the grounds that: Due to Diane Hoyles visit to Post Office®, North Bransholme branch on 30th May 06, this branch was subsequently audited on 31st May, in which it was discovered that there was a loss of £59,175.39. Diane Matthews Investigations Manager interviewed you on 01st June 06, you informed her that you had not stolen the money but had been falsifying your accounts since November 2004 to cover losses. Falsification of accounts is clearly unacceptable, is a criminal offence and breaches Section 12 para 4 of the Subpostmasters contract. Section 19 para 1 of the Subpostmasters contract states "Dishonesty is viewed most seriously and any Subpostmaster or Sub-Office Assistant believed to have carried, or taken part in, an act of dishonesty against Post Office Ltd may be prosecuted. Furthermore, any Subpostmaster so involved renders himself liable to summary termination of his contract."

You are also reported stating in your interview with investigations that Katherine Ayres had admitted taking some money from the Post Office accounts, which you were aware of and you did not report. The fact that you did not report her dishonesty leaves you in breach of Section 15 para 10 and 11, also Section 19 para 7. Supplementary to this, Section 15 para 2 states "Assistants are employees of the Subpostmaster. A Subpostmaster will be held wholly responsible for any failure, on the part of his assistants, to apply Post Office rules, or to provide a proper standard of service to the public. He will also be required to make good any deficiency, of cash or stock, which may result from his assistant's actions." You were aware of losses in

the accounts, which you chose to hide rather than make good as per your contract Section 12 para 12.

Even though you had concerns about Katherine Ayres stealing Post Office money, which you were responsible for as Subpostmaster, you did not take steps to prevent further theft and gave her keys to the Post Office/safe. Therefore I believe that you have not safeguarded Post Office funds adequately and have breached Section 12 para's 5 and 6. You also allowed Katherine repayment terms in which to pay back money that she had stolen, which I believe constitutes lending her money which breaches Section 17 para 15.

I also believe that you have breached Section 1 para's 13 to 15 as you have not followed operational rules and instructions correctly because: Losses were occurring and you did not place sufficient controls in the branch to stop them occurring. Prior to the suspension, the Inventory team had asked you to return money and you chose to ignore this instruction. You also had not registered your assistants Colleen Kays, Theresa Holmes and Wendy Lyell.

You may, if you wish, appeal against my decision. If it is your intention to appeal, you should notify me, in writing by 26th July 06. The format of the appeal can be either a personal interview or written submission. Should you wish to progress this avenue, I will arrange for the appeal to be heard by a member of Post Office Ltd Appeals Authority.

Decision paper on summary termination of Ms JL Skinner's Contract for Services as Subpostmaster at Post Office®, North Bransholme branch

Background

The inventory team alerted the Leeds Area Intervention Office to a potential cash holdings problem at Post Office®, North Bransholme branch on 25th May 06. The e-mail received from David Dixon from the Inventory team said "One of my colleagues spoke to the postmaster recently as they had ordered cash when they were asked to return cash. Looking at this office in detail, we have not had a valid cash declaration since Tuesday 16th May and we have had 10-20% invalid cash declarations historically. The office is ordering large volumes of notes when they should be returning cash, but they actually denied holding the cash that was showing on Saturday. Even through the cash declaration for that Saturday was invalid, the figure that we got from a different source should still be accurate. The levels of cash have now reached a worrying point, so would it be possible for someone to visit the branch to make sure all funds are on the premises. They need to remedy the problem with their cash declarations, and also reduce their cash holdings as they are as high as previously declared. I have serious concerns about this office. The generated ONCH was 74k on Saturday, but the postmaster said that they had nowhere near that amount. They did not say exactly how much cash they reckon to have held, but there is a discrepancy."

Following receipt of this e-mail Di Hoyles and Julia Stephenson attended the site on 30th May 06 and advised Janet Skinner that they wanted to check the cash holdings. Janet informed them that £40k would be missing and she suspected that Katherine Ayres a staff member was responsible for stealing this since January 2006. When challenged by Di about how she had managed to balance with the money missing, Janet said that she had made the accounts balance and she had falsified her accounts.

She also admitted knowing that Katherine Ayres had taken money and was allowing her to pay it back in instalments, Katherine was allegedly placing her repayments in a bag and leaving in the secure area. However this bag could not be located on 30th May 06 and despite this member of staff stealing, Janet was allowing Katherine keys to the branch and the safe. Her rationale for this being because Katherine only lived across the road and could get to the branch to open up when Janet could not.

Investigations have interviewed Janet and she has continued with her version of events that she has not stolen the money but has falsified the accounts. A charge letter was sent to Janet Skinner on 27th June 06, letting her now that I am considering terminating her contract for services. I asked for a reply by 11th July 06 and she has not responded despite receiving the letter and therefore I have decided to terminate her contract for services and a letter has been sent to this effect on 12th July 06, giving her two weeks to appeal.

Facts + versus mitigation –

• Instructions to return money had been ignored and instead more money ordered by Janet Skinner.	• Janet had previously put staff on individual stock units to tackle losses.

- Other non-conformance issues had been identified recently in April 06 and interventions had been made due to non-completion of P356 or FSA/AML compliance.
- Janet Skinner knew that £40k would be missing when Di Hoyles and Julia Stephenson visited on 30th May 06. She said she suspected Katherine Ayres of taking money and this had been going on since January 06. She had not reported this to anyone.
- On 30th May 06 Janet Skinner also made admissions of falsifying her accounts to cover up losses.
- When Diane Matthews from ID interviewed Janet Skinner she said she had been falsifying her accounts since 2004.
- Janet Skinner admitted allowing Katherine Ayres the opportunity to pay back money in instalments that Katherine had stolen from the Post Office. Janet was looking for a bag on 30th May 06 that she said Katherine put her repayments into. This bag could not be located and was not shown to Di Hoyles or Julia Stephenson.
- Janet admitted to Di Hoyles and Julia Stephenson on 30th May 06 that she had been through a costly divorce and she had to buy her husband out of her property.
- Di Hoyles reported on her visit log of 30th May 06 that the staff in the Post Office were acting strangely and suspected they may well be involved.
- When Di Hoyles returned to the branch on 31st May 06. A lady asked when the PO was opening and said that it was always running out of cash.
- Janet had given keys to Katherine Ayres so she could open the branch when Janet was running late.
- Janet could not say where the missing money had gone but she had not stolen it and has given ID permission to view her bank accounts. She also gave permission to search her premises but not whilst her children were in attendance.
- Janet said that she had returned some money at one point as requested through the cash replenishment system.
- Some money that Katherine Ayres had stolen had been repaid in a lump sum in Feb 06. This money had been placed in a bag but this could not be located.
- Janet said that when Katherine was on sick leave that the balancing improved.
- Janet had been going through a costly divorce and had to buy her husband out.
- Di Hoyles reports that on her visit on 30th May 06 that staff were acting strangely and felt they could be involved.
- Janet had given Katherine a warning for short changing customers.

- Also on 31st May 06 Janet handed Di some empty cash bags of £20 notes from a bank but she told Di it contained £50 notes of which there was £5K and the customer had bought premium bonds. Di took these and left them for ID to look at as it appears there could be some money laundering, the staff had not ask for ID as per the anti-money laundering regulations. Janet went onto say that the same customer deposited another 3K in cash for the same too which suggests the office could be used to launder money. Janet thought the cash could have come from a bank, which was robbed in Hull around that time.
- When the audit took place on 31st May 06 it was discovered that the loss actually stood at £59216.43.
- When Di Hoyles visited North Bransholme on 02nd June 06 she saw a printed notice on the door about being a thief, she assumed the shop staff must have put this on the door as they do not get on with the Post Office staff.
- Di Hoyles also discovered an envelope containing £48.42 with receipts, which a customer called Shawn was due to collect. Di has tried to find out whom this belongs to and the money is presently locked away in the Area Intervention Office.
- Three members of staff working at Nth Bransholme have not been registered Kays, Holmes and Lyell.
- In Janet's ID interview on 30th May 06 Janet stated:
 1. She had put everyone on individual stock units to eradicate poor balancing.

2. In November 2004 Katherine Ayres had a loss of £1400 and an agreement was made between Janet and Katherine, in which Janet said she would inflate the cash until Katherine had paid the money back. Janet stated that £500 had been repaid by Katherine in a lump sum in Feb 06.

3. Janet also said that Katherine

GRO During this time of her absence the losses had got better and so Janet returned to a shared stock unit. Shortly after December 05 large losses started to appear again.

4. In trading period 10 a shortage of £7500 occurred, Janet covered this up by inflating the cash.

5. This loss rose to £9K in Feb 06 and in large amounts until the £59k present loss.

6. Losses in the branch were declared as cash in a dormant stock unit CC. From 26th April 06 to 25th May 06 an amount of £40,253.85 was declared as cash when there was no cash present. A further £19k had gone missing in 3 working days and Janet offered no explanation to why.

7. Janet admitted that she operated the branch poorly, did not try to stop losses occurring, she did not speak to staff about the losses and did not try to find the perpetrator.

8. Janet only worked 4 half days and left staff in charge and admitted turning up for work late.

9. Janet knew it was wrong to inflate her accounts.

10. Janet said Katherine had cried when Janet rung her to tell her the audit team were coming in.

11. Janet would not allow her property to be searched on 01st June because her children were in.
12. Janet gave ID permission to view her bank accounts.
13. Janet has no proof of staff stealing.
14. Janet said she was an expert on Horizon and had been one of the first to receive training.
15. Janet knew the proper process for settling losses and gains. But had not settled them properly instead inflated her accounts.
16. Multiple customers had complained about being short-changed. Janet gave Katherine a warning after 3 complaints. Weeks prior to the audit Janet had an incident where she had gone into the branch on a Saturday and found money stuffed in a drawer underneath a card.
17. Colleen refused to let Katherine have a set of safe keys.
18. When Janet took the temp spmr on at Nth Bransholme she was warned by the previous spmr Caroline Rand to keep her eye on Katherine and that Katherine had been investigated by Utd News but was cleared and re-instated.
19. Janet does not trust Katherine and said her son's **GRO** and that his girlfriend was in **GRO**
20. Janet is not scared of Katherine and Katherine does not have a hold on Janet.
21. Branch trading was conducted monthly and cash declarations were done monthly also.

Decision

Ms Janet Skinner has admitted false accounting over a lengthy time, can offer no explanation as to where £59k of PO cash entrusted to her has gone. She was allegedly warned about Katherine from the previous Spmr but despite this she gave Katherine access to the safe and premises. Janet by her own admission said that she had experienced bad balances and as a result of this placed her staff on individual stock units. Whilst Katherine was **GRO** the balancing got better and so she reverted to a shared stock unit. When Katherine returned losses started to occur but Janet did not make staff go back onto individual stock units. Neither did she report the losses to anyone.

Janet talks about having suspicions about staff stealing but has no evidence to prove this theory and I feel that she has not taken precautions to safeguard cash entrusted to her. In fact I believe that she has encouraged losses to occur by not introducing adequate controls.

I feel that her behaviour has been dishonest for a sustained period of time, she seems to know how to run a PO but chose not to, by her own admissions she is a Horizon expert. She has also not conformed to instructions by not returning money, registering staff etc.

I believe that we cannot reinstate Ms Skinner following the admissions she has made about false accounting and we do not know where £59k has gone. Therefore I feel that we cannot entrust more cash to her and allow her to manage any more PO branches.

I feel that the only decision available is to summary terminate her Contract For Services.

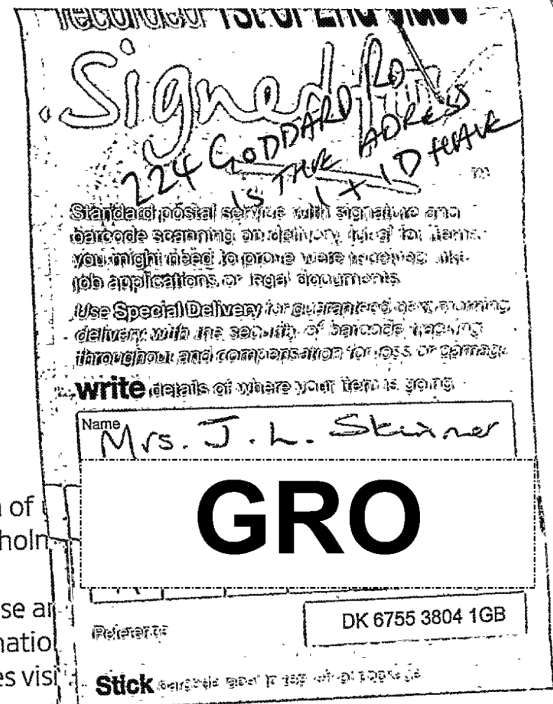

Should you choose a personal interview, you may be accompanied at the interview by a friend, who must be a Post Office employee, a registered Sub Office Assistant or a Subpostmaster, who may also be a representative of the National Federation of Subpostmasters. You also have the right to request and receive all information relating to the aforementioned charge.

Audit of Post Office® North Bransholme branch, Branch Code 174321

On Tuesday 30th May 2006 I was asked by Craig Thompson, Branch Auditor, to conduct an audit at North Bransholme the following day. Diane Hoyles from the Area Intervention Office had just visited the office and after counting the cash a large shortage was discovered. The subpostmaster was temporarily suspended by Diane on Tuesday 30th May 2006.

Accompanied by my colleague Mrs Lynne Eastwood, Branch Auditor, we met Diane Hoyles at the office the following morning, Wednesday 31st May 2006, to conduct an audit at the office to ascertain the actual shortage.

Upon the arrival of Miss Janet Skinner, subpostmaster we entered the secure area. Miss Skinner disabled the office and safe alarm and logged onto the Horizon system. Lynne Eastwood was then put onto the Horizon system and pulled off Office and Balance snapshots for the relevant stock units, A,B,C and OOH.

Lynne counted the cash and stock whilst I input the Branch Trading Statement onto the Laptop. The cash and stock was double checked by myself and a shortage in the cash of £58942.41 and £274.02 in the stock was discovered.

Miss Skinner left the office at approximately 1000am with the permission of Diane Hoyles in order to visit her solicitor.

Examination of vouchers on hand did not reveal any discrepancies.

Contact with the suspense team showed no outstanding amounts were owed by Miss Skinner. The Management Information Team was also contacted and the inward and outward remittances were verified.

As Miss Skinner had been suspended the previous afternoon and was not on site after 1000am no compliance tests were completed.

The office was balanced and as there was no temporary agent available to take over the office all cash and stock was removed out of the office on Wednesday 31/05/06 at 1500pm. Unactivated packs of National Lottery Instant scratchcards were sent by Special Delivery to Camelot.

A one shot password was obtained and the £59216.43 was posted to the Late Account .

The Pass number for the alarm system was changed and all safe keys and datestamps were in the possession of Diane Hoyles. We all left the office at approximately 1600pm.

Audit of North Bransholme Post Office® branch, Branch Code 174321

Section 1 - Introduction

An audit of the above branch was led by myself on 31/00/2006. The purpose of this audit was to verify financial assets due to the Post Office® and confirm compliance with a range of Business processes, procedures and regulatory requirements.

Section 2 provides a management summary, including the financial audit result.

Section 3 details a breakdown of the result of the financial audit.

Appendix A details the areas of non-compliance to regulatory matters and Appendix B details areas of non-conformance identified during tests of selected policy and procedures. Both appendices include the actions agreed with during the closing meeting.

Section 2 - Management Summary

The financial audit revealed a current trading position of £ 59216.43 short, subject to a reconciliation of some figures (undertaken after the audit). A breakdown of this figure, including any pending transaction corrections or losses being settled centrally, can be found in section 3.

Due to findings revealed at audit, and a decision taken by the contracts and service manager to temporary suspend you from your role as subpostmaster pending further enquiries, compliance testing was not carried out on this visit, therefore there are no appendices attached.

Section 3 - Result of the Financial Audit

Financial assets to the value of £15543.71 were physically verified compared to the amount due to Post Office® of £74760.14.

The difference between these figures is broken down as follows:
