She was talking about RM collection offices and postbags as if that's something POL does As she's mentioned before she thought Horizon was another example of a Government IT debacle and that innocent subpostmasters were the victims. Clearly this is wholly untrue in two respects, probably untrue in a third When Paula / Al were explaining things she jumped to an understanding and it was difficult to bring her back from that first impression / correct her She spoke very openly about things she probably shouldn't be so open about. While it was fine with POL there are probably some meetings she will have on POL where this is not appropriate so we should be clear when there are things she can't say (that is, she can't just keep using the excuse "I'm commercial so I say things other Ministers might not" and laughing all the time) She's uncertain about which Ministers have responsibility for what. She thought we briefed Anna Soubry as RM Minister on something to do with POL when it was the BIS Banking team (which she didn't realise BIS had as she thought it all sat within HMT) briefing their Minister, Anna Soubry, on banking.
