Thanks for this. In addition to information on the branch investment costs (i.e. how much POL were putting in in addition to WHSmith) the Minister was also interested in what happens to the old branches. I supplied both bits of information yesterday ahead of BEIS Orals. If UKGI colleagues want to see this let me know.

I have also agreed with Sam that when the Minister receives Post Office branch franchising correspondence that she is particularly interested in, and would like more detailed briefing on the local issue, Sam will flag the to us and we will work with POL to provide it.

On the remuneration, I don't think there was an explicit action, but it is something I know the Minister is interested in. So I'm going to work with POL on how we can explain the current network transformation model simply i.e. we're no longer paying postmasters a fixed fee but now variable, and that the post office element of the business is just one part – a strong retail business is vital too.
