Horizon is a big, complex IT system with lots of moving parts. Users constantly raise questions about how to use it and what it produces. How then do we identify what will be relevant for a prosecution (past or present)? This may be too specific for the ToR, but things to consider include: how far do we need to go to investigate and document user enquiries to determine whether or not it is a disclosable issue? are there any triggers or red flags at which a user enquiry becomes something which requires disclosure? is there anything we can do to limit the need to review all past prosecutions each time a disclosale issues arises? what processes could we have in place so that if the adequacy of disclosure is raised, we can demonstrate that we have acted prudently?
