Hi Rod
I agree that it's a good letter but I do wonder whether we risk losing some of the impact and substance of our complaint by (arguably) focusing too narrowly on the correct interpretation of specific wording of the guidelines?
I have no problem (indeed we probably need) getting into the weeds of, eg, the proper meaning of 'contributor', but I would be inclined to place a bit of broader and more impactful context around it - the bottom line being that the programme was a lazy and sensationalist stitch up when, with the assistance and guidance we provided and would have continued to provide, it could have been genuinely informative, balanced and fair to all. Instead, it was rather transparently manipulated to serve a specific set of interests, rather than represent a genuine journalistic endeavour which one might have come to expect from Panorama and the BBC.

I believe this escalation is warranted given the high-handed approach the BBC has taken to us to date (e.g. that despite the substantial briefings we provided, the rules around fair treatment of contributors do not	
apply to us because we did not put up a spokesman,) and the number of issues which could still reported upon (CCRC investigation; Chairman's Review; class action etc).	estinate.
The Editorial Complaints Unit provides a written "decision" on the complaint. This is provided to us in	
draft in the first instance, which should lead to a more considered response from the BBC.	
If the complaint is rejected, we can appeal the decision to the BBC Trust if we so choose. The receipt of the Editorial Unit's response would therefore also be a convenient place to drop the complaint if we did not	
want to pursue matters any further (e.g. we could take the view that although we still feel justifiably aggrieved, we have better things to get on with).
